- Learn how to use Microsoft word as a word processor, not as a computer version of a typewriter
- Spend some time learning APA V6
- Find and hire an editor. The money spent will save money on tuition, frustration, and such downstream. A positive ROI!!
- Use the Writing Center for help
- Use Grammarly to check grammar, punctuation
- Ask almost anyone to read and critique

• Use active voice; minimize passive voice • No block quotes; paraphrase • Zero to few inline quotes; paraphrase • Apply critical thinking concepts Clarity Accuracy Logic Precision Breadth Depth Significance Relevance Fairness

• Words not to use

- He, she, his, her, we, us, one, deal with, impact, British English, slang, colloquialisms, ...
- Cite in past tense
- Do not use contractions
- Do not start sentences with the word "it" as "it" is ambiguous
- *Italicize* for emphasis in APA; quote marks require citations
- Double space all lines of text in APA V6
- In citations, & goes inside (), while and goes outside ()

- Be sure to provide either the doi# (first preference) or the url of the journal homepage (second preference) for journal articles listed in the References section.
- Please do not list a database such as EBSCOhost, ProQuest, Academic Source Premier, or other university article databases
- Support assertions with evidence.
- Opinions, beliefs, or feelings are acceptable in journalism, but not in academic writing.

Scope

- The problem statement is critical; everything flows from it
- Scope a dissertation or doctoral study to a 12-18 month timeframe
- Don't try to solve world hunger; a great topic, yet not researchable in a few months.
 - Downscope to community hunger for example Same topic, different scope

Alignment

- State the problem
- Derive the purpose statement from it
- Derive the research questions (RQs) and / or hypotheses from the problem statement
- Derive interview questions (IVs) from the research questions if qualitative
 - Participant responses to IVs aggregate to "answer" the RQs
 - "Answers" to RQs aggregate to "answer" the problem statement, thus closing the loop

Problem Statement Criteria The Litmus Test

Is it justified?

Is there <u>evidence</u> that this problem is significant to the professional field?

2. Is it grounded in the literature?

Can the problem be framed in a way that will enable the researcher to either <u>build upon or counter the previously</u> <u>published</u> findings on the topic?

Is it original?

Does the problem reflect a meaningful <u>gap in the research</u> <u>literature</u>? (PhD)

Does the problem describe a meaningful gap in practice? (DBA)

Is it amenable to scientific study?

Can a <u>scholarly</u>, <u>systematic method of inquiry</u> be applied to address the problem?

- Download related dissertations to your topic and see how they were written and packaged
- Learn from imitation
- Suggest 100 or so references
 - 85+ peer reviewed journal articles published in last 3 4 years; a few seminal articles acceptable
 - A few academic or professional books recently published; a few seminal books acceptable
 - Professional / Government Websites acceptable NO: Textbooks, Wikipedias, dictionaries, encyclopedias, newspapers, magazines, popular websites, blogs, student dissertations or doctoral studies, student papers, and so on
