- 3. Visit the stand outside the City Offices, which holds handouts on **regulations and restrictions in Edmonds** regarding fencing, landscaping, getting a new furnace, painting, and roofing, etc.
- 4. Talk to those of us who were at the March 3rd meeting at the Church. We think the Edmonds letter's Q&A gives a misleading impression of that meeting.
- 5. Ask Edmonds Council what assurances they can provide (in writing) that, once annexed, our local needs will be met. In fact-finding sessions earlier this year, it was clear they wanted to do right by us but expected the city's other priorities to take precedence.
- 6. Try out the Edmonds annexation tax calculator (on their website). Be sure to enter every tax, fee, surcharge, etc. Several of us found pure taxes went down but the total stayed even or went up. Also try to account for inspection fees, code filings, etc if you have home improvements or home business arrangements.
- 7. Recognize that this isn't just a referendum on taxes. Many of us live in the County because we want to be left alone. Edmonds (as codified in its regulations) has a more invasive understanding of its role.

If fact checking puts you in the reject-annexation camp...welcome. Check the other side.
